A BEER THAT REALLY GOES DOWN WELL

The Travellers Rest in Burslem, Stoke on Trent is the brewery tap of one of the best new small breweries in the midlands, The Titanic Brewery. It was set up late in 1985 by the landlord of the pub, John Pazio in a nearby small industrial unit and all the beers brewed are absolutley delicious! This is largely because John seems to be very enthusiastic, dedicated and consientious with everything that he does. To me his is just the sort of venture CAMRA should support in every way. If all brewers were the same, there would probably be no need for CAMRA to exist. A wide range of tasty beers at good prices providing welcome relief from the bland, standardised products of the big seven (and some independents) is the order of the day where Titanic are concerned. The curious name comes from the Captain of the titanic who came from Stoke. He was Captain Smith which is the name of the strong 1050 beer, Best Bitter (1036) and beers but at Christmas they are joined by a special strong 1080 barley wine. Premium is my favourite, it is a full bodied, well hopped beer, perhaps not to everybodies taste, but that is where Titanic really scores in my opinion, the beers are DISTINCTIVE so you can immediately tell them apart from others! All the beers are sold at Bernies Off-Licence occasionally, but the total lack of free houses in our area severely limit its availability. However, many pubs in the Black Country do sell Titanic on a fairly regular basis, it is certainly worth seeking out!

A FINE OLD SWAN



After months of uncertainty, changing of architect's plans and building, work on the Old Swan in Netherton (Ma Pardoes) has finally been completed. In Association with CAMRA, finance company Mercia Venture brought this famous home-brew pub about two years ago to save it from possible takeover and closure from a larger brewery. The old pub while being a unique and characteristic gem was not quite finantially viable so Mercia wanted to enlarge and modify the pub in an effort to bring in a wider variety of customers and also develop the free trade side of the adjacent brewery. CAMRA was keen to see that the essential charm and decor of the old pub was not lost and by and large I don't think it has been. A new lounge has been built next door to the original public bar which seems to have almost doubled the size of the overall pub. It is quite smart in a traditional sort of way with much more emphasis on food than in the old pub.

The original smoke room has been preserved and like the new lounge is pleasant but could be anywhere really. The outstanding individuality of the pub will always be in the old bar which fortunately has been revamped quite tastefully. All the classic featureslike the etched mirrors in the bar back, the old heating stove in the middle of the floor and the enamelled ceiling depicting "The Old Swan" are still there. One major improvement is the uncovering of the original carved wooden bar front. This was previously hidden by horrible boring sheets of formica, a move that sums up the mentallity of "pub improvements" in post-war years. The old rather odd wallpaper has been swapped for some more "rather odd" flowery wallpaper but you can't have everything can you?....

Some of the brewery equipment is also new because of the recent fire and I thought the beer tasted slightly different but this is only to be expected after a long lay-off. The basic taste and light colour is the same as it has always been. Taking everything into account, the new Ma Pardoes is still a great hostelry to be

CASTLETOWN TO CLOSE



It is very rare that a Boro Banter appears without some gloomy news of brewery takeovers or closure and unfortunately this one is no exception. Castletown of The Isle of Man were recently taken over by Heron and Brearley and it will be closed down. Local CAMRA members fought hard to save it but in the end over 90% of Castletown's shareholders sold out! Efforts to get the Government's executive council to hold a public enquiry which would have blocked the merger also failed. Although this closure does not affect our area, it is sad that competition is practically nil on the island. GOOD BEER GUIDE LISTED



There is no need to wait until January 1st for the 1987 GOOD BEER GUIDE as it is in the shops and pubs now! The cover price is £4.95 but CAMRA members can claim their usual discount -£3.50 for them from headquarters in St. Albans including postage and packing. The local branch also have a few on sale at meetings. Britain's best selling pub guide is now in its 14th edition and as usual it is a must for enthusiastic beer drinkers and pub goers in general, especially those who travel around the country. It contains details of over 5000 pubs, including notes on facilities such as rooms for children, acccommodation, gardens, food, camping, suitability for the disabled etc. The informative and unique breweries section also lists about 250 real ale breweries.

Another CAMRA - LETTS "1987 BEER DRINKERS DIARY" has been published recently too. This costs £2.95 in the shops but again CAMRA members can buy it from H.O. at £2.70. As


